PERMIT CONDITIONS

This permit authorizes the importation of the listed articles, under the conditions specified below. A copy of this permit (including all conditions) must accompany all shipments authorized under this permit.

In addition to this permit, genetically engineered plant materials regulated by 7 CFR Part 340 must be imported with a valid APHIS 2000 Permit or Notification. Please call (301) 851-3935 or email Biotechquery@aphis.usda.gov for more information.

Any person who violates the Plant Protection Act (PPA) of the United States, individuals or corporations who fail to comply with these conditions and authorizations, or who forge, counterfeit, or deface permits may be criminally or administratively prosecuted and found guilty of a misdemeanor which can result in penalties, a one-year prison term, or both. Additionally, any person violating

the PPA may be assessed civil penalties of up to \$250,000 per violation or twice the gross gain or gross loss for a violation that results in the person deriving pecuniary gain or a pecuniary loss to another, whichever is greater. In addition, all current permits may be cancelled and future permit applications denied.

This APHIS-issued import permit only covers compliance with APHIS regulations and requirements. Therefore, this APHIS permit for the commodity to be imported does not reduce or eliminate the permittee's legal duty and responsibility to likewise comply with all other Federal and State regulatory requirements applicable to the commodity to be imported.

1. The plant materials need to be apparently disease-free and pest-free, be free of soil, other foreign matter or debris, other prohibited plants, noxious weed seeds, and living organisms such as parasitic plants, pathogens, insects, snails and mites.
2. SHIPPING:
 - (a) The permit number must be written on the outside of the package(s) and on the bill of lading.
 - (b) Include an invoice or packing list indicating the contents, which are clearly labeled.
 - (c) Include the permit with the package.
 - (d) The material must be packaged and shipped in a sturdy closed container that will prevent the possible escape or introduction of plant pests during shipment and maintain isolation from the domestic environment during transportation.
 - (e) Any packing material used in the consignment of the plant material must meet the requirements of § 319.37-9, and wood packing material used in the consignment must meet the requirements of § 319.40-3(b) and (c).
3. Upon arrival in the United States, the plant materials are subject to inspection by a representative of Plant Protection and Quarantine (PPQ) or by a Customs and Border Protection, Agriculture Specialist (CBP-AS). If found apparently free from exotic pests, diseases, federal noxious weeds, and soil will be returned to the permittee, the mails, or to the carrier for delivery to the permittee.
4. Upon arrival of each shipment at the CA Fruit Growers Laboratory, the permittee shall notify Anthony Jackson, PPQ-CA, by both email at Anthony.S.Jackson@aphis.usda.gov and phone (916) 930-5536, the Office of the Ventura County Agricultural Commissioner at phone 805.388.4343 and Magally Williams, CDFA at phone 951.782.3271.
5. If the permit holder discovers that the regulated material received is not what is authorized then they must phone and email the CA SPHD (see A. Jackson contact info above).

Whenever stored :

- (c) the entire lot of imported plant material will be labeled "Quarantined material, to be used only in accordance with a valid permit"
- (d) the imported plant material is to be securely stored in a limited-access refrigerator in a secure room/building, to prevent pilferage and unauthorized use

After the imported material is removed from the shipping container, the shipping container(s) will be autoclaved or double bagged and taken to the landfill.

6. The imported plant material is to be used solely for 'Destructive Analysis' inside the secure Fruit Grower's Laboratory facility (log-in room, processing room, ICP Instrument room, LECO analyzer room), located at 853 Corporation Street, Santa Paula, CA 93060.

Each lot of imported plant material shall be kept separated and not comingled with other imports until it is ready to be disposed.

Access to the imported material must be limited to you and those you approve.


Propagation/ growing and long-term storage is prohibited.

Following receipt, until ready to dispose, the plant materials may not be distributed to any other location or person without permission from this office.

7. From the time of receipt, until destruction, the permit holder is responsible to maintain the identity of all permitted material by properly labeling the plant material with the permit number, the genus, species and cultivar name, country of origin, and date of arrival. Each imported lot must be tracked and identifiable and can only be located in the designated facility.

The permit holder will keep legible records on all permitted plant material, including analysis and disposal dates.

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8. At the conclusion of the tests, all imported plant materials not consumed by the tests are to be destroyed by sterilization in an autoclave.

All utensils, equipment, etc., which came into contact with the imported plant materials are to be sterilized or thoroughly cleaned (with the wash water being boiled for 15 minutes or disposed of into a municipal sewer system).

9. The facility where the work is performed is subject to unscheduled inspection by PPQ or designated representative during regular business hours. The importer is responsible to provide appropriate documentation to the inspector and/or SPHD for the imported material under this permit.

10. The permittee will report permit related problems (followed by e-mail) to the CA SPHD designee Anthony Jackson, phone (916) 930-5536 and email Anthony.S.Jackson@aphis.usda.gov and State Plant Regulatory Official's (SPRO) Nick Condos, phone 916-654-0317 and e-mail ncondos@cdfa.ca.gov within three days of the occurrence.

11. You must keep your permit valid for the duration that plant materials are in your possession. If the permit holder leaves the facility (resigns, quits or is let go) where the plant material is kept, all plant material must be destroyed unless a new individual who assumes responsibility for continued maintenance submits a PPQ Form 588 and obtains a permit prior to the permittee's departure. If any information changes (i.e. telephone number or address), you must notify our office immediately with the changes.

12. Failure to comply with all of the conditions specified in this permit or any applicable regulations or administrative instructions, or forging, counterfeiting, or defacing permits or shipping labels, may result in immediate revocation of the permit, denial of future permits, and civil or criminal penalties for the permit holder.

DIRECTIONS FOR PACKAGING AND SHIPPING QUARANTINE MATERIALS UNDER PPQ 588, PPQ 546, PPQ 587 AND PPQ 525A PERMITS FOR IMPORTATION INTO THE UNITED STATES.

Unless otherwise instructed in the permit conditions, attach the GREEN/YELLOW label (PPQ 508) securely using clear/transparent tape to the EXTERIOR of the shipping package. Packages without labels on the EXTERIOR may be refused entry even if the labels are enclosed.

Place on the EXTERIOR OF THE PACKAGE the name and address of shipper and a statement of the contents.

Place within the package the permit holder name, delivery address, phone number, invoice, and, when required, a phytosanitary certificate.

THE LABEL WILL DIRECT THE PACKAGE TO THE PPQ PLANT INSPECTION STATION AUTHORIZED UNDER THE PERMIT. THE DELIVERY ADDRESS MUST BE THE SAME AS INDICATED ON THE LABEL OR THE PACKAGE WILL BE REFUSED ENTRY.

The package may only contain materials authorized under the PPQ 588, PPQ 546, PPQ 587 or PPQ 525A Permit. It will be refused entry with possible civil penalties if unauthorized materials are included.

DO NOT WRITE ON, MODIFY, OR DEFACE THESE LABELS. These labels cannot be reused or duplicated for additional shipments. Each individual label will have a distinctive barcode. Underlying packaging/wrapping must carry the address, a prepaid delivery waybill, carrier account number, or postage must be included and any other information required to direct the shipment to its final destination. USDA APHIS does not defray any additional shipping costs for transiting the shipment through an inspection station as the initial US destination.
